Spotlight on TOSH 7.0: An Interprofessional



For the seventh year, the Teaching Oral -Systemic Health program (TOSH) took place at the New York Simulation Center for Health Sciences (NYSIM). The program consisted of a clinical simulation and case study experience that brought together a grand total of 780

dental, medical, nurse practitioner and midwifery students from NYU and pharmacy students from Long Island University (LIU) in interprofessional collaborative work groups. Student and faculty feedback shows a positive impact of the interprofessional TOSH simulation and case study experience where students collaborate to learn the HEENOT oral exam and develop an interprofessional management plan for a diabetic patient with oral health problems. We look forward to continuing this quality interprofessional programming in the years to come.
