

Spotlight: Oral Health Effects of HPV-positive Oropharyngeal Cancers

A recent article from the Oncology Nursing Society (ONS) *Voice, Manage Late Effects from HPV-Positive Oropharyngeal Cancers*, highlights rising rates of HPV-positive oropharyngeal cancers (OPC) among middle-aged men in the U.S.

The article includes a comprehensive overview of how to educate patients on management of late effects from OPC. Many of the late effects occur in the mouth - dysphagia, lymphedema, mucositis, xerostomia and tooth decay, to name a few - and effective interprofessional collaboration by members of the oncology, dental, and primary care team, has the potential to prevent these problems.

Oncology nurses are well-positioned to provide oral health education and resources to patients recovering from OPC because oral health habits are vital components of effective long-term care of OPC.

**Oral Cancer Screening Initiative
OHNEP Oral Health Champion Colleen Palay**



Colleen Palay, MPH, BSN, RN, OCN, CPHQ, an OHNEP Oral Health Champion, recently hosted a successful Oral Cancer screening event with her team at Cogswell Hall a temporary housing shelter for those experiencing homelessness in Cleveland, Ohio.

Hoping to target the most vulnerable population in Cleveland for oral cancer screening, the University Hospitals Community Outreach Coordinator worked with the Community Engagement Supervisor at the YWCA to identify an appropriate location for the program. With grant support from the American Head and Neck Society (AHNS), otolaryngology residents, faculty, nursing and administrative staff from University Hospitals Cleveland Medical Center created a mobile clinic space with two exam rooms.

Patients were screened upon entry by nursing staff for high risk behaviors including tobacco and alcohol abuse, lack of dental care, and/or presence of an oral lesion, along with a comprehensive health history and oral examination. Appropriate referrals and information were provided by the administrative team if patients required further care. All individuals were provided with American Head & Neck Cancer information pamphlets and oral care supplies provided by the AHNS grant. Efforts will be made to continue to bring this oral cancer screening mobile clinic to other locations through the greater Cleveland area.

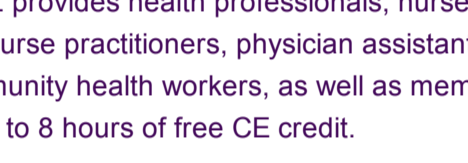
Online learning has become the new normal across the country, with didactic courses taking place over video conferencing instead of in the classroom.

Smiles for Life: New 4th Edition Coming Soon!



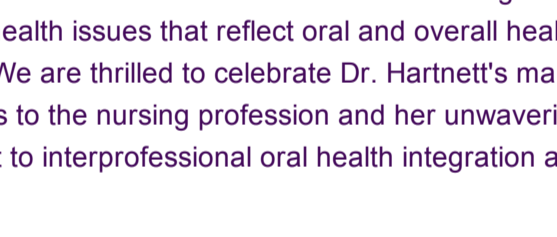

The SFL curriculum addresses vital topics of health equity, health care disparities, and the impact of social determinants on health and care delivery. Downloadable slideshow presentations, case studies, quizzes, are available for in-class or out-of-class use by faculty and students. 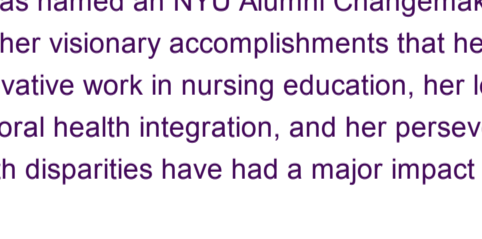
Dr. Erin Hartnett Selected as a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing

Dr. Judith Haber Recipient of 2020 NYU Alumni Changemaker Award

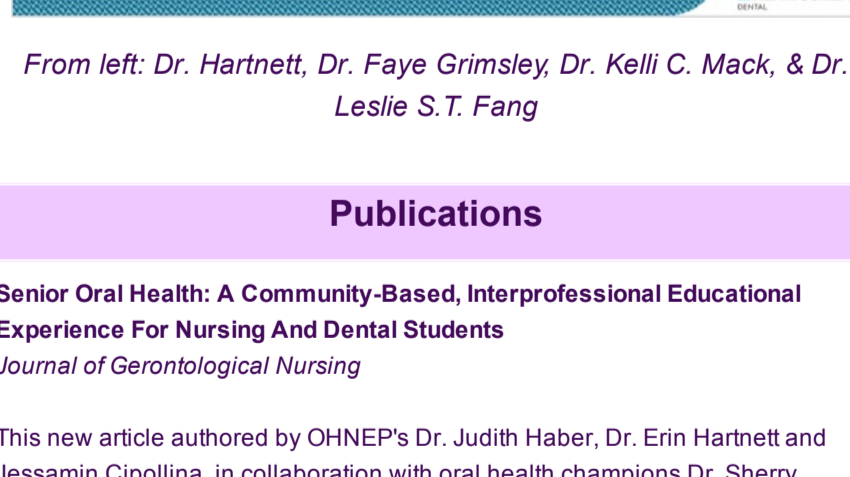

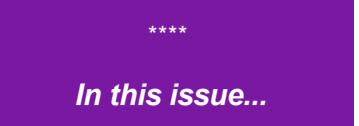
